Number of members in attendance: 10

Meeting called to order at 12:09

- Members are asked to come to the meeting next week to vote on important upcoming issues.
- All members were informed of Mrs. G's passing – the footage used by KTVU can be found on Youtube for any who wish to see it.
- A motion was made by Belinda to accept minutes from the weeks of November 7<sup>th</sup> and November 14<sup>th</sup>. Sharon moved to second and all were in favor.
- Scotty provided us with an update on his job as treasurer: He and Ann are in the process of transferring the books.
- Andrew Mentzer will provide us with an update on the West Central Mountains Economic Development Council on November 28<sup>th</sup> and Coach Lee Leslie will come down to talk about the Committed program on December 19<sup>th</sup>.
- Winter Jamboree Update: Ronn and Kathy from the West Mountain Snowmobile Club will be unable to conduct a snowmobile fun run this year by themselves. Sharon will reach out to the club members to see if they are able to help. If not, we will reach out to Cougar Mountain Snowmobile Club or the Snowmobile Club in Donnelly to see if they are able to assist with a fun run. If there is no response from any of the clubs, the dinner auction will occur on the same day as the Perch Assault.
- The Chamber phone will be moved to the Birch Glen. Scotty has taken over the mail box duties and will take care of the bills that come in. All mail and calls will be recorded from now on so that we can track our interest volume and present that information in future grant proposals.
- Marketing Update:
  - The Marketing Committee has decided to join the Adventure Bicycling Group in its efforts to create a 2-3 day bicycle loop. Cascade will be the hub for this new bike loop. Money from our grant will be put towards this project. This project will be done in conjunction with pathways.
  - The committee is also in the process of finishing two videos; the Economic Development video promotion business in the area and the 100-year celebration video. The 100-year video will be 15 minutes long and will be shown December 30<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 at the Roxy Theatre. After the showing, people are encouraged to gather at Van Wyck where there will be DJ entertainment, hot dogs and hamburgers, and 100 lanterns will be released.
- Chamber meetings for January through March will occur at Besides the Tracks. Meetings during the period of April through June will occur at the Lakefront Bar and Grill. After that, the rotation will resume with Reos and then Route 55.
- The Rec Center had a good turnout for the first day of Thanksgiving Day Camp. There will not be a Christmas Break Day Camp but there will be a Kids Night Out on Thursday
